PASTOR'S NOTE:

We all know the expression, "There's no 'l' in 'team'". We generally agree that the more hands involved in a particular project, the faster and better the result will be. Group work builds on the unique gifts each member has and divides the work so that the burden is shared. This method is true in school, sports, the workplace, playing music, caring for the family property, being a citizen of some society, in fact, it's perhaps true in every scenario a person can think of. That is, all except one – human salvation.

That salvation of humanity through the proclamation of the Gospel is best done by God. God never makes a mistake; God is always faithful; God is love; and, God is all-powerful. It seems pretty clear what God should do. God should save us by himself. Our involvement will only slow salvation down, we will make it more difficult due to our lack of fidelity and sinfulness. Seems obvious to me but this is not what God has done. In the Gospel from Saint Mark, we hear the story of the Lord sending out the twelve Apostles. Christ sent them and "gave them authority over unclean spirits." Since God is all-powerful, in all honesty, God does not need our help. God could have simply thought and willed our salvation with the eternal realization of his Kingdom and it would have been so. Why then did God take the more difficult path of involving us in his work?

Saint Paul wrote, "he destined us for adoption to sonship as his own through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will." To be a child is to have received from and share in the life of the parent. If God's will be that we be his daughters and sons then this means we are to share in his life. The mission of the Son is thus shared with us. It isn't about more hands leading to greater speed and efficiency, rather it is about sharing in the "family business." To be enveloped by the love of the Father, to share in the life, death and resurrection of the Son through our participation in his proclamation. This is what it entails to be a child of God, to have been given our inheritance by him. "With all wisdom and insight God has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth."


