Pastor's Note

There's a part of the Mass that is stunning in its boldness and beautiful in its faith. We rarely hear it, however, because it is one of several options of different "Prefaces" that are available prior to the Eucharistic Prayer, that is, the prayer of consecration. In addition, it can only be used at the Daily Mass in which there is no Feast or Memorial. In other words, this bold and beautiful part of our Mass may only be heard on a regular weekday. The second paragraph of "Common Preface V" contains the following: "His Death we celebrate in love, his Resurrection we confess with living faith, and his Coming in glory we await with unwavering hope." Incredible! Imagine yourself before Jesus Christ dead on the Cross. Looking at him lifeless and understanding the what and the why of his offering, it seems improper to "celebrate." But this is precisely what we do, "we celebrate in love" his gift of love. Imagine yourself standing before the empty tomb outside Jerusalem. Instead of thinking some grave robber has been up to no good, one confidently proclaims "He is Risen from the dead." This isn't blind faith but the result of faith and a reflection that life and love is still always given to our hearts. Therefore, there must be someone who is perfectly faithful and still gives. That "someone" is the Risen Lord. Imagine yourself amidst the chaos, fright and suffering of life in the

To See, To Love, To Serve

What helps to keep Christ as the center of our lives? As Christians, our love for the Lord, and truly in response for all that he has done for us, we can find ourselves longing to know Christ more and striving to follow him. We want to be firmly rooted and living steadfast out of his love for us.

St. Ignatius of Loyola, in the *Spiritual Exercises*, prayed for the grace "to see thee more clearly, love thee more dearly and follow thee more nearly." With clear and precise insight, St. Ignatius understood that to grow in holiness and be a disciple of Christ, one had to give one's whole self – the mind, the heart, and the will. When we work to deepen our understanding of who Christ is, when we commit ourselves to prayer and when we give of ourselves through service to others, we are responding in love to the One who has loved us first.

We know that growth in holiness takes a lifetime. And, at Divine Mercy Parish we want to be intentional about these three elements of this Christian dynamic: coming to know

world. Within this tumult, one lives through a hope formed by faith – he died on the Cross out of love, he was raised from the dead because his love is eternal, and so we will never be cast aside or forgotten. We will be gathered together by Christ and given to the Father as the Son's gift because we are the Father's daughters and sons. He will come again in glory to give everlasting life.

Our bold and beautiful faith is prophesied by the Prophet Isaiah in this week's first reading. He prophesies that there will be a "Suffering Servant." This Servant of God will be crushed with pain. He will make his life an offering for our sinfulness, he will carry our iniquities. He will make many righteous and holy. Many will see, hear and understand "the what and the why." They will see and hear the tender and all-powerful love of God. They will let themselves be given over to his life and to be overwhelmed by his love. To be given over and to be overwhelmed in a way in which they are not lost or discarded, but rather, are found. We are found by him, found through him, found with him and found in him. With a heart on fire, we declare to ourselves, the Church and the world, "His Death we celebrate in love, his Resurrection we confess with living faith, and his Coming in glory we await with unwavering hope."

Blessed Carlo Acutis Relic Tour St. John's NL October 24-30



The first-class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis will be in the Archdiocese from October 23-30. On October 30 the relic will visit Divine Mercy Parish (Newfoundland Dr. site). Join us as we welcome the relic of the first millennial to be beatified.

The Relic of Blessed Carlo will arrive at Divine Mercy Parish early in the afternoon. Veneration of the relic will be available throughout the day along with the following program of events:

Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991-2006), a Catholic Italian teenager who died in 2006, was beatified on October 10, 2021 in Assisi. Acutis, a gamer and computer programmer who loved soccer and the Eucharist, has been the subject of interest around the world. Pope Francis referred to Carlo as a model of holiness in a digital age. Carlo's life should teach today's young people how to properly use and enjoy technology, including the internet and social media. His motto was "To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan." On July 1, 2024, Pope Francis approved plans for the canonization of Blessed Carlo, the first "millennial" saint.
