Pastor's Note

Since Christianity began to emerge as a new faith 2,000 years ago, a challenge of enormous power has been levelled against it — If God is all Good and all Powerful, why is there suffering in one's life and in the world? Sometimes one can think that if one just prays hard enough, then God will remove the suffering. Or, if one negotiates generously enough, that is, "I'll do this if God does that," then the suffering will be taken away. Chances are that we each have known or currently know painful suffering. Chances are, we likely have tried one of the above two methods, if not both. How, then, do we reconcile our faith within our experience of suffering in life?

The problem of suffering has been wrestled with by some of the greatest minds in Christian history, Saints like Augustine and Thomas Aquinas. While the "solutions" may solve the problem philosophically and theologically, they seem to still falter when it comes to human experience. One can read and understand but one's heart may remain anxious, uncertain, fearful and weighed down by sadness. We want God to come and fix our problems. We want him to make everything ok again. If the problem of suffering remains to be solved at some future date, such as, with the Beatific Vision or his return in glory, there is something we can receive through God's Incarnation that gives us the ability, humility and strength to live in the light even if shrouded by darkness.

A New Addition to our Daily Mass Schedule

Beginning this week, we are adding three Masses to our Daily Mass Schedule. In addition to our 9:30am Daily Mass – Monday through Friday, we will also have Masses, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays will take place at 7pm in the evening. The new schedule will offer those unable to attend the morning Masses due to work and other commitments, an opportunity to attend daily Mass.

Now, due to the many Advent and Parish activities during the month of December, the scheduled locations for the new Masses will be a little lopsided. See the next column for a full listing. In January, the schedule between the two sites of the parish will become stable.

When God assumed human flesh with the Incarnation, God embraced the totality of human life. In assuming human flesh God has eternally revealed the immeasurable intensity of his personal love for each of us. We can lose people we love, we can feel overlooked by the world, we can have our dreams shattered, but we can't lose him. The Incarnate God understands and feels our sufferings. His constant response is to love even more, to give more of himself to us. Every time we come to Mass we have an immediate experience of this. After acknowledging our sins in the Penitential Rite, we listen to God's teaching and revelation in the Word. But God doesn't stop there, he then gives himself to us in the Eucharist. One may still walk among the uncertainties of this world. One may be weighed down by loss and grief. One may waver due to fear and anxiety. But we continue to live, laugh and hope because we know we are not lost, overlooked or shattered. We know, in Jesus Christ, we are loved always. And "that is enough for me," as Saint Ignatius wrote. It is "enough" because the Lord is everything. When he assumed human flesh, he has placed himself with us and beside us. We are his, and so, come what may, we will, in the end, be ok, in fact, we will be perfect.

Advent Reconciliation Service Tuesday, December 10 7:00pm

As we're in Advent, parishes everywhere are having Advent Reconciliation Services. Whether you've gone to confession recently, or haven't been for many years, this is a great opportunity to prepare for the coming of Lord that we celebrate at Christmas.

In the Sacrament, we do not go to the priest just to list our sins, have them forgiven, and receive a penance (although this all happens in Confession). Rather, and most importantly, we come to celebrate the mercy and forgiveness of God that we are graced with in our lives. We come to the Sacrament with a sense of joy for what God has already done through Jesus Christ in our lives and what God continues to do – fill us with his mercy and love. We can come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation with confidence and trust in God who has 'loved us first.'

We hope you will join us on Tuesday, December 10 at 7pm in the church (St. Paul's site) for our Advent Penitential Service. Several Priests will be available for individual confessions. Come, experience once again, the mercy and forgiveness of the Father.

Advent as a liturgical season is a time of preparation, anticipating the great Church feast of Christmas – the birth of Christ, the coming of the Incarnation of God in history and in His Second Coming.

As such, it is a time of penance, of turning away from sin and of hopeful and joyous preparation as we make room of the coming of the Savior in our world and in our own lives.
