Pastor's Note

A sincere Christian often finds oneself stuck behind an imposing roadblock. The roadblock is of one's own construction. It prevents us from continuing forward. It feels as if we are just spinning our wheels. Our sincerity, surprisingly, can open us to a tempting thought – "I want God but surely God wants me to have my faith and life in order first." And so, in a terrible error, we can tell God to "circle back" later. We give ourselves a reprieve, more time to get things and ourselves right. The sad truth, however, is that we will never get things and ourselves in perfect order. There will always be the impulse to clean a little more, to rearrange one last time, to commit to yet another ambitious plan for our faith. Consequently, rather than echoing Mary's words to the Archangel, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me," we can ask God to give us more time, to check later. In our reading from the *Acts of the Apostles*, however, we are shown by God the Holy Spirit, that God reconciles, chooses and calls, justifies.

Our First Reading deals with a major controversy in the Early Church which led to the first Church Council, The Council of Jerusalem. The debate surrounded the question of whether a non-Jewish convert, a Gentile, would first have to adopt Jewish religious practices from the Mosaic Law before becoming Christian? Because

Jesus was Jewish, as were the Apostles and most of the original followers, it seemed reasonable to require the adherence to Jewish religious practices as part of this new Christian faith. Through God the Holy Spirit it became clear to the Apostles and church elders, that these practices, by and large, were not to be continued as Christian requirements. The Lord's birth to Mary and Joseph, and his Passion and Resurrection have made all things new. A principal preoccupation of the Mosaic Law was to help people be reconciled with God, to be in right relationship with him. Jesus Christ shows us that God the Father now reconciles us to himself. His love and mercy are perfectly revealed in the Cross. The Lord's blood, that is, his love and mercy, cover and fill our imperfections, our sinfulness. God gave himself when we were still unrighteous, as St. Paul writes in another passage. We never have to ask God to "circle back," to give us more time to get things and ourselves in perfect order. All we must do is accept and embrace his encompassing love and mercy. To say with Mary, despite our doubts, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me."

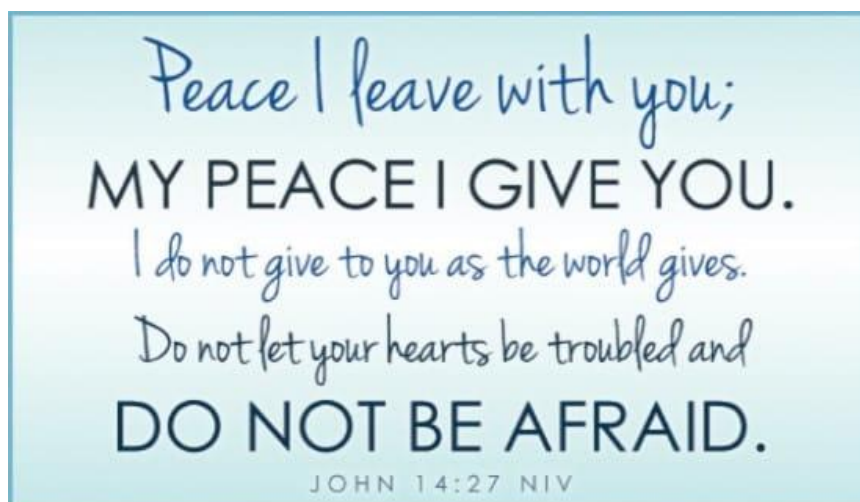

The parish offers different opportunities throughout the year to grow in love and keep Christ at the center of our lives. To See, To Love, To Serve, encourages us all to keep the fire of discipleship growing through the deepening of our understanding, our prayer and our serving. Our Bulletin offers a four-week cycle exploring a different aspect of Catholic Faith through the lens of Seeing, Loving and Serving. This week, we look at the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in prayer.



Heart Speaks to Heart

June is the month traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This is not just about venerating an image but of engaging in a living relationship with Christ himself. In the Encyclical *Dilexit nos* (He loved Us) Pope Francis explains how the heart of Jesus symbolizes boundless divine and human love, calling us into personal intimacy. This devotion, deeply rooted in Trinitarian love, draws us into a relationship where divine and human love meet in Christ (#48-54).

Through the Sacred Heart, we encounter Christ not as an abstract idea but as a living Savior who invites us into trust and dialogue. Pope Francis writes, “The venerable image portraying Christ holding out his loving heart... invites us to encounter, dialogue, and trust” (#54).

Pope Francis encouraged believers to embrace this devotion, urging everyone to echo the prayer of St. Thérèse of Lisieux: “Jesus, I trust in you” (#75-90).

In the final chapter of the encyclical, Pope Francis reflected on the intense love Christ has for humanity, as seen through the revelations to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Christ’s Sacred Heart burns with love but often meets indifference. His cry, “I thirst,” is a plea for love in return, especially through the Eucharist. Pope Francis calls the faithful to respond to this divine love not out of obligation, but out of a deep desire to console Christ’s heart. He invites us to embrace a life of love and service, especially to the poor and marginalized, as a way of offering love for love (#164-171).

The encyclical encourages the us to develop a deeper devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Pope Francis calls for moments of prayer, reflection, and meditation on this divine-human love as a way of drawing closer to the heart of God and allowing His love to transform the world.
