# Pastor's Note

Near the end of the *Spiritual Exercises*, Saint Ignatius of Loyola describes the dynamic of love. He writes, "Love consists in a mutual communication between the two persons. That is, the one who loves gives and communicates to the beloved what he or she has, or a part of what one has or can have; and the beloved in return does the same." In other words, when loving another, one gives of themselves, and, likewise, the one who is first loved does the same in response. We can approach the Christian life in two ways. The first is the more common. We try and obey the divine commands. God as God has absolute authority and our obedience is due him. The second, and less common, is inclusive of the first reason but expands through it being a response of love.

In the Second Reading, Saint Paul instructs us "to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ . . . [who] is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords." Paul reminds us that our obedience to God is to be given to God because God is God. God is the "only Sovereign." This is completely true. At the same time,

however, we can enhance it or make it even more beautiful for God.

Our obedience may look the same on the outside. If we try and obey God because God is God, or if we obey because of this reason and our seeking to love God, it will look the same. God, however, sees our hearts and knows the additional reason or impulse. We try and follow his command because of his absolute authority and because we really want to. We want to, and so, we look for a way to love back, for a way to love in which God knows and feels. I believe thoroughly that this pleases and delights God. We know from our lives what it feels like to be knowingly loved. It is pleasurable, delightful. And if we are made in God's image and likeness, it must be similar for him. Part of being in love is to do what pleases and delights the one we love. It is doing the extra not only what is required. Or, as Ignatius wrote, "Love ought to manifest itself more by deeds than by words."
